There I discovered a person from a farming family who had to discontinue studies due to poverty, borrowed money, began with small 4 powerloom machines, gradually started and more spinning, weaving and garment factories, sugar mills, planted lakhs of trees and committed to give higher education to female employees and made thousands of them graduates.

Dr K. P. Ramasamy, fondly known as 'KPR', was born in the year of 1949 in an Agricultural Family Kalliampudur Village, Periyar District. Tamilnadu. KPR is the Founder. Mentor and Chairman of 'KPR Group'. As a child, he had to discontinue studies in the college due to economic reason and helped his father in tilling the soil. With ambition to do something in his life. managed to borrow Rs. 8,000 from his uncle and made a humble beginning as a Power loom cloth Manufacturer in 1971.

With hard work, dedication and discipline, it blossomed into a Textile Empire. 'KPR Group' having a Revenue of Rs.7,500 Crores was built on values, integrity and caring for workers.

His successful journey expanded from Textile to Ethanol, Automobiles Sugar, Power, Education. The flagship Company, 'KPR Mill Limited', is one of the largest and most efficiently run vertically integrated Apparel Manufacturing Companies in India having 12 'State-of-the-Art' production facilities in the State of Tamilnadu employing nearly 31,000 dedicated Employees; with the capacity of 1,04,000 MT of Yarn in spinning, 157 Million in Knitted Garments in 4 garments Units and in a Processing Unit with the capacity of 25,000 MT With Zero Water Discharge.

In his drive towards eco- friendly environment, installed 62 MW windmills and roof top solar Power 12 MW at Tamilnadu and established 90 MW Co-gen cum Sugar Plant at Karnataka to source green power that meets most of KPR's power requirements. Quality is the watchword- be it the products KPR Group manufactures or the service it provides, his strategic plans & dynamic management crowned him as one of the 'Top 100 CEO's of India' and ranked KPR Mill Limited as one of the Top 500 Listed Companies by various business magazines successively.

Beyond being a very successful Entrepreneur, all through strenuous and enduring efforts, the conscience of the man is in contributing to the society from what he has earned. Contribution to Trade & Industry

In 1989, the company started manufacturing fashion apparel and entered the buzzing export market following it up with backward integration into spinning and processing. In 1996, it set up its first spinning unit at Sathyamangalam with 6,000 spindles to produce cotton hosiery yarn. Today it has a total capacity of 3,60,000 spindles producing approximately 1,04,000 MT of cotton yarn per annum of counts ranging from 10s to 40s. Every yarn produced adheres to the highest of quality. standards Today, KPR manufactures and markets cotton yarn, compact and melange yarn, knitted fabrics, readymade knitted garments and sugar. Meanwhile, wind power coupled with co-gen power boasts of a healthy bottom line.

He is counted among the top 100 business leaders in India, leading a group of companies that is in the top 500 listed companies in India with a workforce of over 35,000 people mostly from rural India and with over 90% of them women.

Vertical integration from yarn to garment gives KPR an edge with a lower cost of production than unintegrated peers helping this group to become one of India's largest knitwear garment export businesses which supply to top global fashion brands like Marks & Spencer, H&M, and Primark.

Not satisfied with just supplying to other brands, they have also started their own desi retail brand called FASO that is available online as well as in 2500+ outlets across India.

KPR has strong family values that run through its corporate structure to build a strong loyal family of employees, vendors, and stakeholders.

Even during pandemic full pay and food

During the Covid-19 pandemic, when most factories across the country closed their factories and sent away their labourers during the nationwide lockdown in 2020, KPR Mill gave its workers a choice: "If you stay, we will provide you food, shelter, full salary, and entertainment". Each of their 12 factories has a cinema hall, sports facilities, and an auditorium. All their workers chose to take up this offer.

With zero revenues during the lockdown, expenses were running into crores and lenders were watching closely to see what would happen. Thankfully the lockdown was relaxed in two months and they were able to swing back to full efficiency within a week of restarting operations. Other factories were grappling with labour shortages for several months after. But the risk KPR took paid off and they were able to make up the losses of the lockdown.

KPR meets all the people directly and there is no separation between different levels in the organisation. There is no separate lunch for the Chairman, MD, or staff. Whoever visits the factories, will have lunch together with the staff.

Beyond his successes as a business owner, his real contribution is in managing his business as a vibrant social enterprise that brings positive change to its stakeholders and the planet earth.

Soon after high school when he had just joined college, his father requested him to drop out and come back home to take up a job and support his family. As a dutiful son, he followed his father's instructions and terminated his education so he could work and support his younger brothers to fulfill their educational goals.

Today he is among the top 100 business leaders in India, leading a group of companies in the top 500 listed companies in India with a workforce of over 27,000 people mostly from rural India and over 90% of them are women. Majority of them are from Hindi speaking States like Orissa, West Bengal, Bihar and Nort East. There is a separate kitchen giving them food of their preference. Every morning starts with prayer. Prayers are conducted in Hindi for them separately. Accommodation is provided in modern buildings with all facilities. There is a shopping complex providing all the necessities at reasonable prices. There is even a beauty parlour. So there is no need for any of them to go out to the cities for any purpose.

Lack of education did not stop this man from dreaming big. He gave his younger brothers the best of education and all of them became professionals and joined his budding business and together with him, created a business empire that is an envy in the textile world, not just in India but worldwide. He did not stop at just educating his siblings, anyone who showed interest in education, he supported them and gave wing to their dreams by financially supporting them and giving whatever help was required to fulfill their aspirations.

KPR Charity for Higher Education

His passion for bringing higher education to first-generation learners grew over the years and has led him to start "KPR Charities" a public trust that created and runs 'K.P.R Institute of Engineering & Technology' which has been ranked at 5th place among the 67 Private Engineering colleges at Coimbatore and is also ranked as one of the Top 20 Institutions in Tamilnadu-as per the survey done by 'Higher Education Review Magazine.

Recently added a novel feather to the crown of KPR Group of Institutions 'KPR College of Arts Science and Research 'with vibrant vision and mission to mould the young minds to reach the next stage in career ladder. The high point of his service towards Education is the establishment of 'KPR IAS Academy' that offers excellent coaching for IAS, IPS, UPSC, TNPSC exams. Many of its aspirants have cleared the Civil Services Examinations under various categories, which were once considered as inaccessible Career. It has been consecutively and successfully dedicating to the Nation the prospective Administrators. In the recently announced 2020 Civil Services Results also, 53 aspirants of KPR IAS Academy have come out successfully as IAS/ IPS/ IFS officers.

Empowering poor women workers

Over 25 years ago, a young woman working at his mill asked him if he could help her complete her education. He remembered his youthful days when he had to quit college to return to his village because his farmer father could not afford to educate all four sons. He realized that he could change the future of this woman by with flying colours, the die was cast for the start of his tireless efforts to support uneducated women interested in improving their circumstances by educating themselves.

Almost 80% of their employees live with them in the factories and when KPR realised that they

KPR Mill's education initiative for women employees yields excellent results

Colimbatore-based KPR Mill Limited has been in the news for its pioneering educational initiatives as part of its CSR activities. Over 27,000 women employees working in the group have successfully completed higher education courses in the last 23 years. Going one step further, it has now successfully trained 52 candidates of which 45 students have already been placed in reputed establishments till now. A report

The company does not insist on workers staying with it forever. We encourage them to take up better jobs after finishing their education because that's what will uplift them and their families.

Today the mills boast of 72 full-time teachers on their rolls who have helped the mill workers to complete Class X, Class XII, and graduation apart from helping them take up job-oriented courses on teacher training, yoga, nursing, computer technology, etc.

With a full-fledged teaching faculty, it has tied up with Tamilnadu Open University and Alagappa University and has around 5900 employees currently studying for various exams ranging from

He has educated 35,500 women mill workers over the last 25 years to complete schooling, earn degrees, vocational courses, and some of them for Civil Services.

Ashwini Sethumadhavan a constable with the Chennai battalion from Tirupathur joined the KPR Mills in 2009. She signed up for BCom the next year and simultaneously prepared for the police exam.

"The teachers and wardens helped me to get books and other study materials for Govt exams and helped me with coaching. If not for KPR Mills, I would have remained a mill worker for life" says the 27-year-old.

KPR believes that "Giving higher education to a woman is as good as educating the whole family. She can raise the living conditions and the education levels of every family member".

Many of its aspirants have cleared the exam under various categories, which were once considered as an inaccessible career for these marginalized people.

Contribution to Women empowerment




Caring for the cattle farm and dairy farm
